

# Zippered Project Pouch with Window



## INSTRUCTIONS

Finished Size: 9" x 12"

# **Items**

1/2 yd Heavy cotton or canvas Featherweight or lightweight one-sided fusible stabilizer 4 or 8 gauge clear vinyl 1 bag zipper at least 8" long Heat erasable fabric marking pen, or fabric chalk Presencia Sewing Thread Roxanne Basting Glue - stick or liquid Sewing Maching

## **Materials**

Cut 2—10" x 13" Heavy cotton or canvas for front and back Cut 1-7" x 10" Clear vinyl 1 Zipper at least 8" long. Can be shortened to fit

**Optional:** Cut 2-9" x 12" Feathertweight one-sided fusible stabilizer

Note: we cut this 1/2" smaller than the body pieces to keep seams from becoming too thick



# **Instructions**

### Set up

- 1. Overlock all edges of both body pieces to reduce chances of fraying.
- 2. Center the fusible stabilizer on the wrong side of each body piece and attach.

## **Create The Window** Figs A - C

- 1. Center the vinyl on the front of one body piece.
- 2. Make dots at corners of window.
- 3. Draw a rectangle by connecting the dots.
- 4. Draw rectangle 1/2" inside of window.
- 5. Draw another box 1/2" inside that window.
- 6. Draw an X in the outside corner square.
- 7. Draw diagonal line from inside corner square to center line of outside square.
- 8. Cut out small center window rectangle.
- 9. Cut diagonal lines.
- 10. Fold flaps to back of fabric. Use Roxanne basting glue to secure and press. Fig B
- 11. Lay vinyl window on wrong side of fabric then place paper backing on top.
- 12. Turn right side up and topstitch closely along the fold. Fig C

## Install the Zipper

- 1. Place Right sides together and sew top edge together using a 1/2" seam allowance. Press seam open. Fig D.
- 2. Use basting glue on zipper tape and lay right side down on wrong side of seam just sewn
- 3. Using a zipper foot, sew a rectangle closely around zipper being sure to leave at least 3/4" from side seams. Sew multiple times along the right and left edges of zipper to firmly secure. Fig E
- 4. Lay bag body right side up and use a seam ripper to open the seam, allowing zipper to open and close.

Zipper completed! WOOHOO!

#### Finish the Pouch

- 1. Trim excess from zipper from the side seam allowance.
- 2. Open zipper fully.
- 3. Pin or clip right sides together.
- 4. Sew bottom, right, and left seams closed using a 1/2" seam allowance.
- 5. Trim corners from the bottom of the bag.
- 6. Turn right side out through the zipper opening.

Fig A - Draw the cut lines






Fig B - Cut, Fold, and Press








Fig D - Sew top and press seam open





Fig E - Instal the zipper





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
